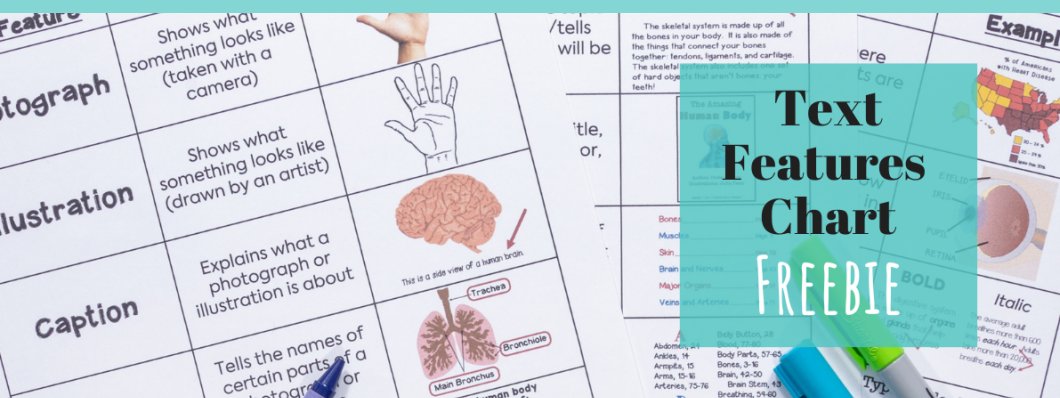

Summarizing Fiction

Do Not Copy the Passage!

Read each of the summaries you cut out carefully. Think about which summary is best and what is wrong with the other 3 summaries. Glue each of the summaries in the correct spot below.

The BEST Summary

Pip's parents always got a babysitter when they went out on "date nights." Pip's babysitter got sick, so Pip got to stay home alone by himself. While he was watching a movie, he heard a loud sound in the backyard. Pip was scared and hid in the closet for the rest of the night. When his parents came back, he asked them not to leave him alone again.

The Summary With Too Many Unimportant Details

Pip heard his mom's phone vibrate and saw it light up. He told his mom that she got a text message. When his mom checked the phone, she saw that his babysitter Randy was sick. Pip promised to go to bed by 9:00. When his parents were gone, Pip watched a movie. When his parents got home, they gave him a hug.

The Summary With Opinions NOT From the Passage

Pip convinced his parents to let him stay home alone by himself. Pip ate an unhealthy dinner and then watched a movie. When he heard a loud noise in the backyard, Pip wasn't very brave and hid in the closet for the rest of the night, even though he probably should have called for help.

The Summary That Just Copied Sentences From the Passage

Once a month, Pip's parents went out on what they called "date night." His parents insisted on getting him a babysitter. Later that evening, Pip's parents left Pip alone for the first time ever. There was a scratching at the back door. Pip ran to the closet and hid. He stayed there for the rest of the night.
